### Housing Authority Board of Commissioners Names New Executive Director

The Housing Authority of Covington (HAC) has a new Executive Director - former Kenton County Judge-Executive Steve Arlinghaus.

Arlinghaus was hired as interim Executive Director by the HAC Board by a 4-1 vote at its monthly meeting on Wednesday, July 18. He replaces the departing Jeff Rieck.

Arlinghaus served as county judge-executive in 2011-15 after being elected to that position, and previously served as a county commissioner and a Fort Mitchell City Councilman. He also is a real estate broker and owns Arlinghaus Realty LLC, which is based in Villa Hills.

Arlinghaus will serve until the Housing Authority hires a permanent Executive Director. No timeline has been set for when that search will begin.
